Prerequisites

All MS-MIS applicants must have at least three years of IT-related work experience. Students also will be expected to have the following knowledge or skills:1) working knowledge of at least two programming languages such as C, C++, Java, Visual Basic, etc.; 2) proficiency in at least one programming language at a level comparable to an entry-level professional programmer in that language; and 3) knowledge of basic statistical concepts (descriptive statistics, regression and hypothesis testing).

Admission guidelines

Admission to the MS-MIS program is highly competitive and based on the academic and professional credentials of the applicant pool. The College of Business generally recommends a minimum of three years of IT-related work experience, a minimum total score of 550 on the GMAT and an undergraduate GPA of at least 3.0 in the upper division coursework. However, all application materials are considered.
