Oxford, Ohio and Tallahassee, Florida – 5 May 2013 – Beta Theta Pi Fraternity and alumni of the Delta Lambda Chapter are excited to announce their vision to collaborate with the Interfraternity Council in restoring this chapter at Florida State during the 2013-2014 academic year.

During the recolonization period, the Fraternity's expansion team will recruit refounding fathers who want to excel on campus as gentlemen, leaders and scholars while building a genuine fraternity experience that will last for generations. Bradley de Wet, 2010 graduate of Virginia Tech and professional staff member of Beta Theta Pi, will assume the role of colony development coordinator and reside in Tallahassee for the 2013-14 academic year. De Wet will assist the new members in their pursuit of intellectual and professional growth and their knowledge and understanding about the values and core principles of Beta Theta Pi, which include mutual assistance, intellectual growth, trust, responsible conduct and integrity.
