The Liberal Studies and Elective courses must be selected to satisfy all area, literature, lab, Gordon Rule and multicultural requirements unless your program meets theses requirements with major courses. Milestones are courses and special requirements necessary for timely progress to complete a major. Missing milestones will result in one of two types of map registration stops. The first level (*Degree Map Offtrack*) is placed following grade posting if the student has missed a milestone (course and /or GPA) for the first time in the major. If a student in non-compliance with milestones for two (2) consecutive semesters (excluding summers) a *Major Change Required* stop is place in the student's registration.

The athletic training program provides the coursework required by the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education Programs (CAATE).
