

FAMILY & CHILD SCIENCES ACADEMIC MAP (255397 or 255315)

This map is a term-by-term sample course schedule. The milestones listed to the right of each term are designed to keep you on course to graduate in four years. To graduate on-time, you need to make sure you have achieved or surpassed these milestones by the end of each term. The Sample Schedule serves as a general guideline to help you build a full schedule each term and may use categories of courses such as LS History for a Liberal Studies History course. The Liberal Studies and elective courses must be selected to satisfy all area, literature, lab, Gordon Rule, and multicultural requirements unless your program meets these requirements with major courses. One of the listed LS Humanities/Fine Arts must fulfill the Literature requirement. All students who enter the University with fewer than 60 semester hours must complete at least one "X" multicultural course and one "Y" multicultural course. Students transferring to the University with 60 credit hours or more must complete one "X" OR one "Y" multicultural course. Multicultural courses can be found among LS History, LS Humanities/Fine Arts and LS Social Sciences.

The Family and Child Sciences program introduces students to applied developmental sciences, with an emphasis on the development process within family contexts and in different settings. It provides students with an introduction to working in applied settings, including hospitals, human service agencies, education, and child care settings. The program requires a 12-hour minor or area of concentration in one of a variety of other academic areas which is individually planned and designed to enhance each student's breadth and/or marketability. With early planning, double majoring or double minoring is a possibility and is encouraged.
