

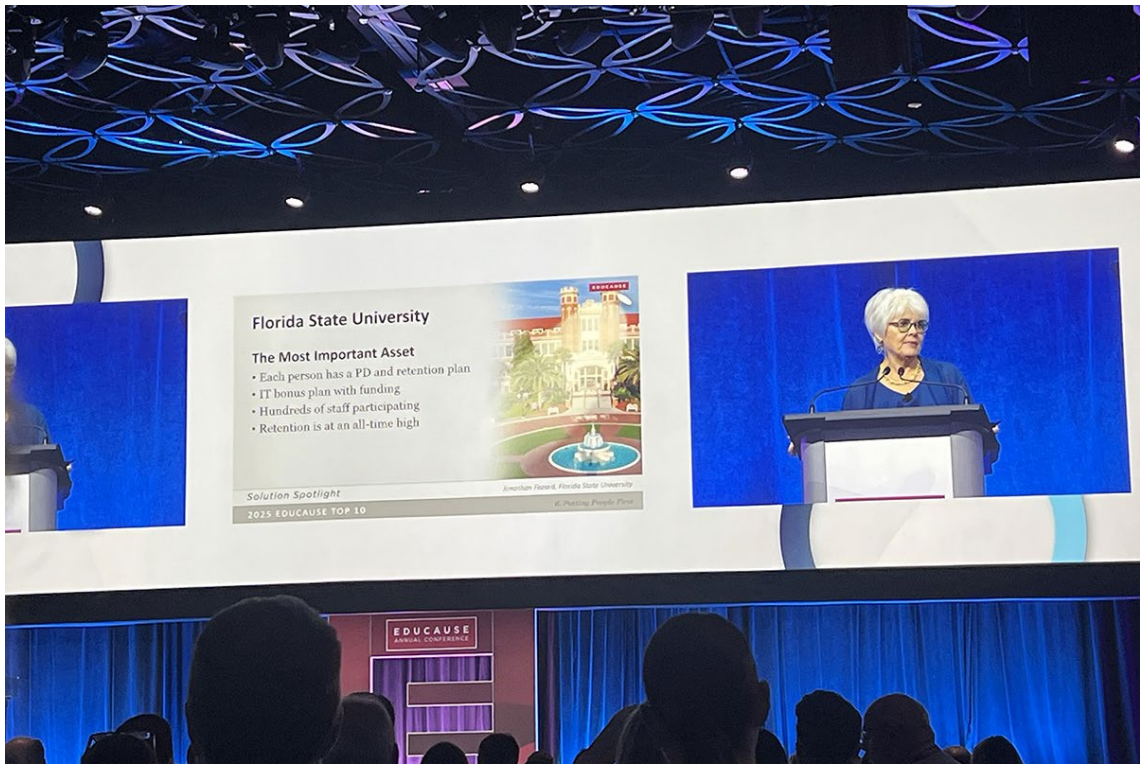

myFSU Service Center Enhancements

The **IT Service Management** team recently upgraded the myFSU Service Center to prioritize the customer experience when requesting billable technology services. With this upgrade, customers can now select the service they need assistance with and submit a description of their request directly through the Service Center. Once the request is received, the team will prepare an estimate, and the customer will receive an email notification from the myFSU Service Center asking for approval to proceed. CAS is Moving to the Cloud

ITS recently announced we are migrating the Central Authentication Service (CAS) to the cloud. This project aims to improve and enhance the security of critical university software systems. There are two phases planned for this project—one dedicated to quality assurance (Q&A) and the other to production (Prod). Currently we are in the Q&A testing phase. All CAS service owners have been notified about this transition so they can authenticate their CAS logins and guarantee their testing environments accurately reflect the information. FSU Faculty Launch AI Pilot Program

Artificial intelligence is revolutionizing industries, and higher education is no different. To stay ahead of the curve, FSU faculty are working on an exciting AI application for the community. Led by faculty members Dr. Paul Marty, Dr. Gary Tyson, Dr. Antje Muntendam, Dr. Vanessa Dennen, Dr. Bret Staudt Willet, Associate Lecturer Lance Kerwin and Adjunct Instructor Bobby Sprinkle, this interdisciplinary team from the fields of business, computer science, education and linguistics is piloting the innovative Microsoft Copilot Studio. This project aims to create a virtual teaching assistant for students, using AI to read course materials, answer questions and even generate study guides. This is just the beginning of FSU's foray into artificial intelligence.

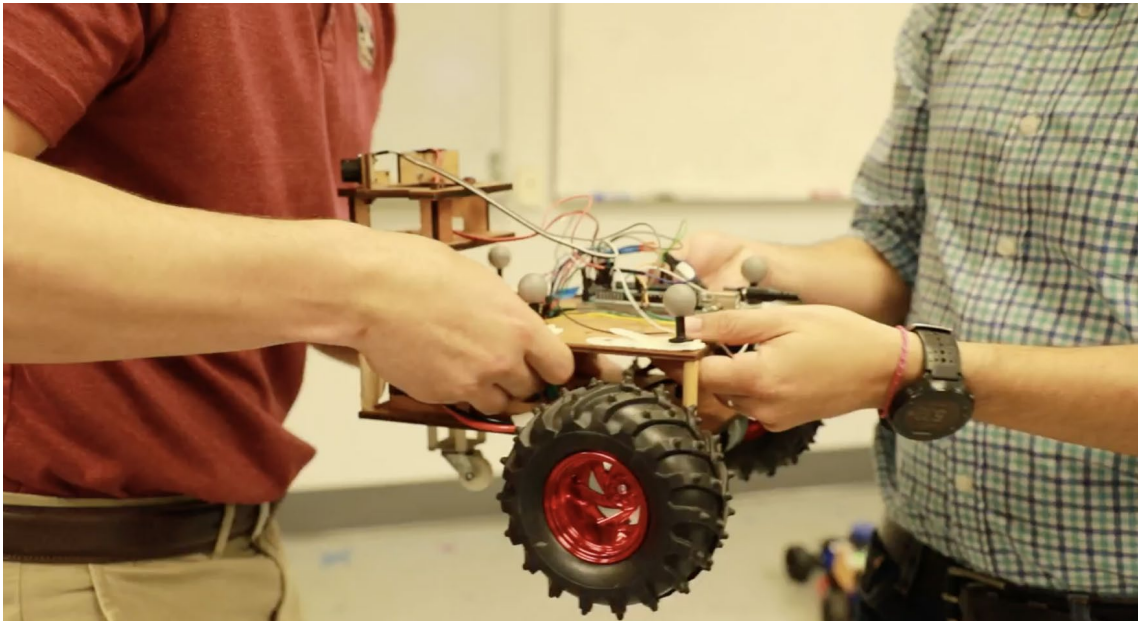

Student Tech Fee Spotlight: Motion Capture Lab

Mechanical engineering students at the FAMU-FSU College of Engineering have access to the Motion Capture Lab, funded by the [Student Technology Fee](#). The lab provides real-time data on student projects to let students know if their design is working properly or whether changes are needed. Since typical undergraduate engineering courses are theory-based, the lab gives students valuable hands-on experience they may not have in the classroom. Along with seeing whether the projects work, the lab can develop control algorithms for mechatronic and robotic systems. These systems can test a real person's motions or even the momentum of a moving object. Excitingly, these are just a few of the ways the Motion Capture Lab can be used to influence student learning. FSU Researcher Dr. Ebrahim Ahmadisharaf Develops Predictive Models

Dr. Ebrahim Ahmadisharaf is an assistant professor in the Department of Civil and Environmental Engineering at Florida State University and co-directs the Water Sustainability and Coastal Hazards Laboratory. His [research focuses on developing predictive models for flooding and surface water quality](#), enabling better risk mitigation and urban planning. With the help of his team, Dr. Ahmadisharaf uses quantitative frameworks to forecast critical flooding characteristics. Leveraging FSU's **Research Computing Center**, he hopes to enhance computational models, improving the speed and accuracy of flood predictions to inform decision-makers and reduce future risks.

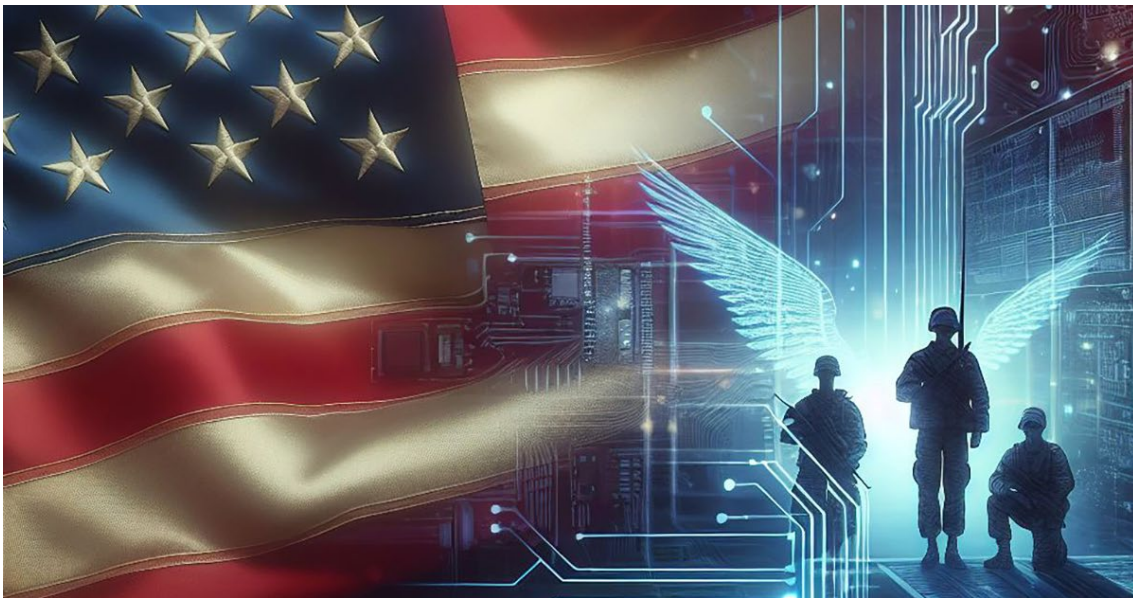

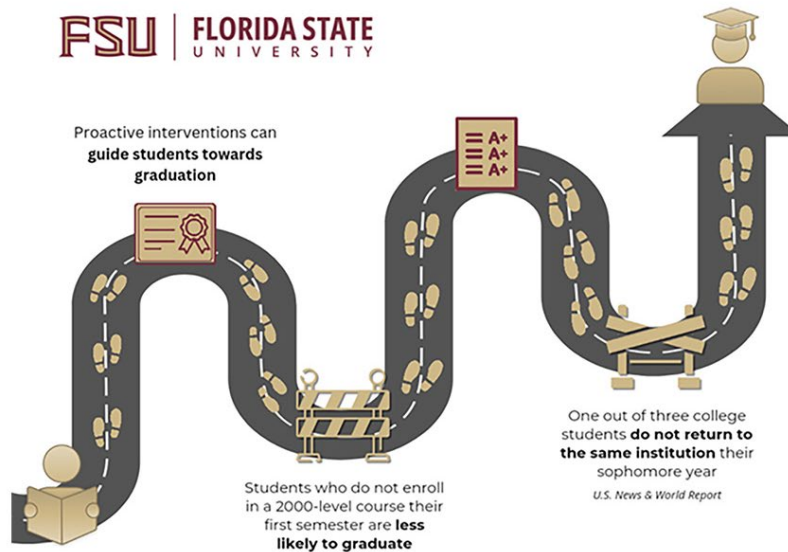

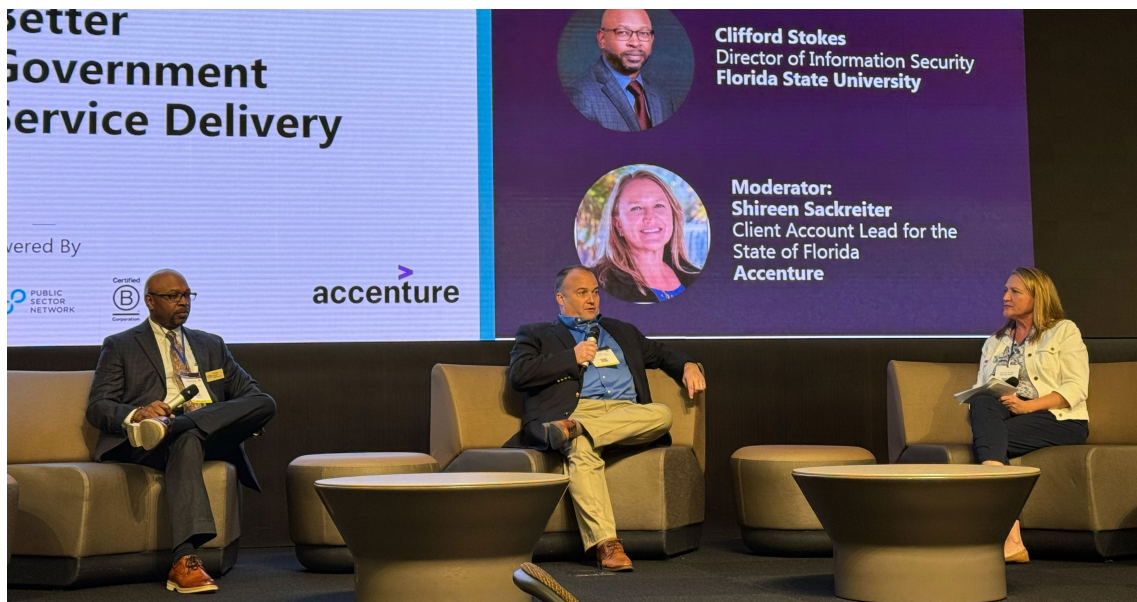

FSU Selected as Finalist for Gartner Innovation Award

This fall, ITS was showcased as a finalist for a [Gartner Eye on Innovation Award](#). Gartner received more than 2,700 submissions for awards, and the [FSU AI Analytics Accelerator](#) project was selected as one of seven finalists in the category of Higher Education Innovation in Admin Systems for our use of AI in data analytics to improve student retention. Though FSU's 96% retention rate is well above the national average, our goal was to find a way to improve the retention of the remaining 4%. ITS partnered with the Office of the Provost and Office of Institutional Research and called upon AI to automate the creation of a predictive machine learning model, aggregating and analyzing billions of pieces of institutional data from across the university. What would have taken top data scientists months to realize, AI produced within minutes. The study found that students who enrolled in at least one 2000-level course during their first semester of college were more likely to graduate than those who did not take a 2000-level course. Through this AI Accelerator tool, advisors and administrators can impact retention efforts and identify other trends impacting student success.



2024 Florida Government Leadership and Innovation Summit

On October 29, the Florida Technology Council and FSU College of Communication and Information hosted the Florida Government Leadership and Innovation Summit at the Florida State Conference Center. ITS' own Chief Information Security Officer **Bill Hunkapiller** and Director of Information Security **Clifford Stokes** were invited to speak at the "Collaboration for Better Government Service Delivery" panel discussion. Bill and Clifford answered questions about information security, technology and more.
